

Guide to the 1951 Census Digitised Statistics

Describes data for England and Wales

Produced by the Office for National Statistics, the Pattern Recognition and Image Analysis (PRImA) Research Lab, University of Salford, and Nomis, Durham University.

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Background of the Project

The ONS has embarked on a program of 'statistical archaeology' projects to make more historical census outputs available to the public in digital form. The project will see the digitisation of census outputs from 1921 through to 1961. This data represents digitised versions of tables from the 1951 Census County Reports and Topic Reports. More data will be added as it becomes available.

These data were never published digitally and until now have been available as scanned images of the printed 1951 Census tables. This project aimed to breathe new life into the data by retrieving and processing content from the 1951 Census County and Topic Reports. The digitisation of the data was performed by the University of Salford's Pattern Recognition and Image Analysis (PRImA) Research Lab.

With the data digitised, the ONS plans to make it available to the public and researchers via the Nomis website.

An important note: there is no attempt being made to update or modernise the language or terminology published as part of the program of historical record digitisation. Rather, the information will be presented, both within the datasets and the surrounding meta-data, as printed at the time wherever possible. There may be some instances in which additional information is given to provide clarity.

The 1951 tables are currently available only as a data download file. Where possible, these will be made available in tabular format in later releases. These tables will be presented in a format which has been designed to be the most accessible and usable to a modern audience. As such they may not be in the same format as originally printed and the presentation will differ from the tables seen in the original county and topic reports.

Quality Assurance of the Data

During processing, errors were identified in the original printed versions. Where possible these have been corrected. As such some of the figures may be different to the original printed versions.

1951 Census Methodology

The following information has been compiled from documentation produced to accompany the 1951 Census Outputs including the General Report, the Census Schedule (form), and the County and Topic Reports. A digitised version of the General Report for the 1951 Census is available to download via the Nomis website¹.

Enumeration

The 1951 Census was undertaken at midnight on Sunday 8th April 1951. Similar to previous censuses the country was divided mainly by the local Registrars of Births and Deaths into enumeration districts and for each district an Enumerator delivered and collected census schedules. Commanding Officers of Armed Forces units at home were responsible for their enumeration, although smaller units were included in ordinary enumeration districts and were the responsibility of the enumerator. The Admiralty undertook the enumeration of all naval ships. All United Kingdom based Armed Forces members together with certain civilians were enumerated by the local Commanding Officer. H.M. Customs and Excise officers enumerated persons on board civilian shipping; the Corporation of Trinity House arranged enumeration for persons on lighthouses and lightships; and the police were responsible for enumerating the homeless. Forestry Commission Rangers were responsible for the enumeration of gypsies and others encamped in the New Forest or the Forest of Dean. The Foreign Office arranged returns for United Kingdom and Colonies citizens resident in consular districts abroad. Arrangements were made with the Registrar General of Shipping and Seamen to obtain information about the crews employed on sea-going merchant vessels registered in the United Kingdom. Special arrangements were made with the Ministry of Supply for the enumeration of persons in establishments that enumerators could not access for security reasons. Censuses were taken on the same date by the appropriate authorities in Scotland, Northern Ireland, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands and in the Irish Republic.

Questions Asked

The place of work question previously asked in 1921 was included, being a more useful way of showing workplace populations classified according to industry and also of providing information on the journey to work between areas.

As well as the question used in 1921 regarding attendance at an educational establishment, a question on terminal education age was included to get an indication on the level and type of education received.

A new question on shared or exclusive use of household amenities was included, and a question on fertility of married women under the age of 50.

Consistency with Later Censuses

Just as outlined above the 1951 Census included new questions and topics that were not asked about in the previous census, so too have additional questions been asked in the censuses that have been conducted since. The ONS website contains a document² outlining all census topics covered from the first census in 1801, through to the 2011 Census. To give a few examples, 1951 did not ask questions related to the number of cars or vans within a household, ethnic group, or religion.

Geography

The data relates to the 1951 County Reports and Topic Reports for England and Wales. The data is available on Nomis down to 1951 district level although not all tables are available at the most detailed level of geography (see Tables section below for area type available for each table). Lower levels of geography will be included in subsequent releases.

Districts

For 1951 district names, there are suffixed acronyms which give further detail about the nature of the district. These are detailed below:

When downloading data from Nomis, where districts in different geographical locations have the same name, the name of the administrative county has been included in brackets after the district name. This is to aid users in being able to correctly identify the district selected.

For some tables the districts included may be limited to Urban or Rural Districts over a certain population size (usually 50,000 or 20,000), along with County Boroughs and Metropolitan Boroughs. A corresponding table with less detailed variable classifications includes Urban and Rural Districts with populations under that size.

Description of Table

Shows population by sex and population density, the number of private households and the population therein, and a count of structurally separate dwellings occupied by private households, including the number of rooms occupied and number of persons per room. This table also includes a population count from 1931 for comparison.

Additional Information

DEFINITIONS:

DWELLING means a structurally separate dwelling and generally comprises any room or suite of rooms intended or used for habitation, having separate access to the street or to a common landing or staircase to which the public has access. Caravans (or a group of two or more caravans when occupied by the same household) and houseboats (or other vessels used as such) are treated as dwellings if occupied on census night but not otherwise.

PRIVATE HOUSEHOLD can broadly be regarded as comprising single persons living alone or groups of individuals voluntarily living together under a single menage in the sense of sharing the same living room or eating at the same table; boarder and domestic servants are including in the household with which they were enumerated, as also are visitors. But a lodger or group of lodgers having or sharing separate accommodation to themselves should have been enumerated on separate schedules and are thus treated as separate private households, distinct from the main occupying household of the dwelling, whether or not they rely on the latter for incidental service in the matter of room cleaning food preparation, etc.

ROOMS For the purpose of the Census the rooms enumerated are the usual living rooms, including bedrooms and kitchens but excluding sculleries, kitchenettes, landings, lobbies, closets, bathrooms, or any warehouse, office or shop rooms.

(4) Areas marked * have been created or altered during the 1931-1951 intercensal period; particulars of such creations or alterations (except those relating to wards) are given either in the 1931 Census County Report, Part II, or in Table 5. ‡ indicates a change of name.
